You are probably aware that the standard land-line telephone has traditionally been the reliable, tried and true way that your AHS alarm reports to our Central Station.

Lately, however, with so many other telephone options, we're frequently asked what happens when somebody switches to another provider or wants to get rid of their land-line phone altogether. Well here's the run-down:

Traditional land-line phones work best for us. Reliability is near 100 percent. But, if you don't use your phone for anything but your alarm system, we recommend considering your telephone company's "Measured Rate Plan" for the lowest base rate. Be careful with this plan, however, because you may be charged per minute for even local outgoing calls.

HELP CATCH THE BAD GUYS

Though Alarm systems can be a deterrent to crime, the simple fact is that burglaries still happen. This is where the 'Crime Stoppers' non-profit organization comes in. Crime Stoppers offers rewards up to \$1000

EASY AUTO PAY

We are now offering a "paper-free", "postage-free", "hassle-free" way for you to take care of your alarm monitoring payment. Just give us a call and we'll send a form for you to fill out allowing us to automatically deduct your monthly monitoring bill from your checking or savings account. Provide us an e-mail address and we'll send you a monthly receipt letting you know that we've received your payment.

Most <u>"Voice Over Internet Protocol"</u> or VOIP services work well also. Our alarms can communicate using Comcast, Charter, AT&T U-Verse and Vonage. Reliable phone service through VOIP is not quite as good as a land-line, but your alarm knows when these phone services are down and will give you a "trouble" light when the alarm does not detect a dial tone. Some VOIP services will not work with our alarm. We have been unsuccessful with Magiclack, Ooma and ACN. The main thing to remember when using a VOIP; the device that provides the dial tone has to be plugged into your home's telephone lines so the alarm can use the phone line. ALWAYS TEST YOUR ALARM AFTER SWITCHING PHONE SERVICES! (continued on back
